**Tues. 15**<sup>th</sup> @ **6:30pm:** <u>Dry but Still Dirty: A New Kind of Drink mocktail tasting</u> – Want to learn how to make a tasty drink that won't take away from your evening? The world of nonalcoholic drinks is booming! Come learn about it with Frances of Reframe in Willimantic! Learn how to make a few different drinks, loosely inspired by the Mad Men era, and leave with more knowledge about how to make drinks that make you feel good, too.

**Wed. 16<sup>th</sup> @ 5:30pm:** Cocktail Culture: Fashion of the Mad Men Era – Cocktail parties in the home have been popular since the 1920s, after the onset of Prohibition. Join fashion historian Karen Antonowicz for a look at cocktail culture fashion as we travel through time. We will focus on silhouettes in clothing from the late 1940s through the 1960s, including men's and women's styles from the popular TV show, *Mad Men*.

**Thurs. 17**<sup>th</sup> @ **1:00pm:** Walk Through the Wadsworth – Primary, secondary, complimentary. Colors are the building blocks of art. Join a free, docent-led tour of the Wadsworth Atheneum and explore the ways artists have used color across time, culture, and mediums. **Tues. 22**<sup>nd</sup> @ **5:30pm:** The Old Yard Cemetery Tour — Join us for a walking tour of The Old Yard, Columbia's Colonial era cemetery, led by local historian Joan Hill. We'll focus on the stone carvers and their work. After the tour, you're invited to join SBL's Nonfiction Book Group (see below). See SBL Staff for parking instructions. In the event of rain, we will pivot to a presentation by Joan at SBL.
