Saxton B. Little Free Library Patron and Visitor Behavior Policy

Approved by SBL Board of Directors, 4/28/25

In order to maintain a safe and welcoming environment for all patrons and visitors, we ask everyone to respect the following:

- Keep speaking voices and headphone volumes low. Small groups are welcome to use the library if they can keep conversational noise to a minimum.
- Patrons shall not enter the building without appropriate clothing including a shirt and shoes.
- Patrons whose bodily hygiene is offensive so as to constitute a nuisance to other patrons
 or library staff may be required to leave the building.
- Always keep personal items with you; the library is not responsible for lost or stolen personal items. Issues regarding potential theft should be referred to the police.
- Food should not be consumed in the library outside of specific library programs or events. Beverages in covered containers may be consumed at study tables and in reading areas beverages are not permitted at computer workstations.
- Smoking, vaping, or any other use of tobacco or marijuana products is not permitted on library property.
- Threatening, harassing, offending, or abusive behavior is not permitted.
- Physical confrontation, fighting, or violence of any kind will be immediately reported to the police.
- Bicycles, scooters, skateboards, roller skates, and rollerblades are not permitted inside the library.
- Animals, other than those used to aid patrons with disabilities, are not permitted in the library, unless they are part of a library-sponsored program.
- Weapons of any kind are not permitted inside the library.
- Defacing, marking, or otherwise damaging library books or other property is prohibited.
- Any books or other circulating library materials must be checked out to a patron's account.
- Use of library telephone is not permitted without permission from the Library Director.

Patrons whose behavior violates this policy will be asked to modify behavior and/or leave. Patrons who refuse to leave after being asked will be referred to the police.
